

LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT

Calgary Pride proudly serves Treaty 7, on the territory of the traditional Niitsitapi Confederacy (Siksika, Kainai, Piikani), Îyarhe Nakoda (Chiniki, Bearspaw, Wesley) and the Tsuut'ina. This land is also home to the Métis Nation of Alberta, Region 3 within the historical Northwest Métis homeland. This place, where the Elbow river meets the Bow, is known by many names to many people, including Mohkínstsis (Niitsitapi), Wincheesh-pah (Nakoda), Kootsisáw (Tsuu'tina), Otos-kwunee (Cree), and Calgary (English). We thank the Indigenous communities of Turtle Island for both the historic and ongoing stewardship and protection of the land we collectively inhabit today. Many nations and people, Indigenous and non, are fortunate to call Moh'kinsstis and Treaty 7 territory our home.

Acknowledging the land is Indigenous protocol, which we honour as a step towards reconciliation and fulfilling our responsibilities as Treaty people. Working alongside all Nations, Indigenous and non, we strive to create safe spaces where everyone can live openly and authentically.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS



As we reflect on the past year, we are filled with gratitude for the incredible journey we've experienced together at Calgary Pride. 2023 was an exciting, complex, challenging, but ultimately successful year. With the support of our dedicated volunteers, staff, and sponsors, 2023 was by many measures the most successful year in Calgary Pride history. Despite the challenges we faced, the 2SLGBTQ+ community has much to celebrate, and be proud of in 2023.

Among the many successes was the annual Pride Parade & Festival. Returning to Prince's Island Park and moving to a 2-day festival allowed many more Albertans to see why Pride is so important to our community. This year we had over 200 groups in the parade viewed by 110k+ spectators. The festival allowed 96 exhibitors and vendors to engage with the community while featuring local and international artists. We're also very proud of our year-round programming. 200 Calgarians joined us at the Central Library for our annual Queerly Festive event. Featuring local performers, Queerly Festive was a low-cost event that allowed participants of all ages to get into the holiday spirit in an inclusive and safe environment. Additionally, we've continued to partner with TD Bank and Calgary Public Library to host our Reading with Royalty events across the city. This is a great way for kids to engage in age-appropriate materials highlighting the importance of friendship, inclusion, and diversity.

Operationally, the board has focused on continuing to make Pride sustainable for the future. Much of this hard work happens behind the scenes and involves modernizing our policies and procedures to ensure our organization remains nimble and efficient. We were very happy that so many folks put their names forward for the board in 2024. This is a great barometer that Calgary Pride is a respected organization and moving in the right direction.

Foremost, among our challenges in 2023 was a declining safety environment for the 2SLGBTQ+ community in Calgary and across the country. Our Reading with Royalty program was a prominent target of protesters and hate online. We are thankful to the community supporters, volunteers, and Royal Readers who continued to come out to support even in challenging circumstances. Additionally, security was heightened at the parade and festival in ways which were both visible and not. The board and staff are committed to holding fun and safe events and work tirelessly with our community partners to do so. The 2SLGBTQ+ community in Calgary proved our resilience and refusal to be bullied in 2023!

Finally, we want to close by saying thank you. Calgary Pride could not operate without the support of our sponsors, volunteers, staff, and community partners. Without you this organization could not continue to provide the vital services to the community that we do. Thank you all for everything you do and we'll see you at Pride in September!

Calgary Pride intentionally invites artists each year from individuals who represent the manifold intersections of 2SLGBTQ+ people in the queer community.

We seek to inspire empathy and understanding that uplifts all people, as we collaborate together to create a city free from discrimination against gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation. This year we were honoured to welcome 2023's Pride Parade Marshals Suzette Mayr, Shane OnYou, Aalayna, Cece Chow, and Adora Nwofor to celebrate and amplify Trans voices. By highlighting the important contributions made by the gender and sexually diverse community, we can bring awareness to the ongoing challenges and hardships that persist in our society.

Calgary Pride provides opportunities for 2SLGBTQ+ people and their allies to come together in learning and mutual support. We remain committed to making our events as accessible as possible, offering an accessible viewing platform on the parade route and in front of the stage at Prince's Island Park, as well as free-of-charge accessible transportation at the end of the parade to bring folks to the festival site.

At every step, Calgary Pride remains dedicated to weaving the threads of reconciliation into the fibre of our Pride movement, fostering unity and understanding to establish a more inclusive and equitable society for all members of our community. Indigenous Two Spirit leaders opened Calgary Pride Week with an Indigenous prayer ceremony and led the Pride Flag Raising at City Hall. These Two Spirit Knowledge Keepers were further invited to lead the annual Pride parade, holding an honoured role in Calgary Pride's celebrations.

TWO SPIRIT CEREMONY & FLAG RAISING

Since 2021, Indigenous Two Spirit leaders have opened every Calgary Pride Week with a ceremony and led the Pride Flag Raising at City Hall. At the Flag Raising, remarks were shared by a Two Spirit Knowledge Keeper from Siksika Nation, Calgary Pride Co-Chair Veronica Carlton. and Her Worship, Jyoti Gondek the Mayor of Calgary. Remarks were followed by a Two Spirit drumming song. In 2023, our Two Spirit Knowledge Keepers also led the front of the annual Pride Parade, holding an honored role in Calgary Pride's celebrations.



In collaboration with the Skipping Stone and the Calgary Public Library, Calgary Pride helped to produce a series of posters featuring key 2SLGBTQ+ figures in history. This collection, called "Always Been Here,' aimed to honour trailblazing queer and transgender individuals who have shaped history. Displayed prominently in Calgary's Central Library, this series worked to illuminate stories that inspire us all to embrace and celebrate the power of diversity.



CALGARY PRIDE PARADE

On September 3rd, 2023 we welcomed folks from Mohkinstsis / Calgary and beyond to celebrate the 2SLGBTQ+ community along our parade route on 9th ave in downtown Calgary. Our annual parade began at 9th Ave and 4th Street, ending at Fort Calgary. From there attendees enjoyed the leisurely walk down to Prince's Island Park, opting for freely accessible transportation options as needed. Both allies and 2SLGBTQ+ community members alike donned their brightest colours to march proudly in solidarity and celebration of Pride.



CALGARY PRIDE TWO DAY FESTIVAL

After the parade, festival-goers gathered at Prince's Island Park to enjoy sensational performances by iconic headliners alongside amazing local talent and DJs, relax in our beer garden, explore food trucks, peruse a curated marketplace, and take in the sights and sounds of Pride! New this year, Calgary Pride introduced a dedicated sober space called the "Queer Garden' for those attendees who prefer an alcohol-free space to unwind.



VOLUNTEER AND COMMUNITY APPRECIATION PARTY

Following an absolutely incredible Pride Week, Calgary Pride hosted a Volunteer and Community Appreciation Party on October 1st, 2023. This free event was organized to show our thanks to the tireless individuals who enabled our success during Pride Week. We shared incredible performances by Fake Mustache Drag, hosted by James Demers, and ended the night with an open dance to the musical stylings of DJ Zane. Attendees enjoyed free pizza from UNA and desserts provided by Crave Cupcake. We are grateful to the Hyatt Regency Hotel for offering their space in-kind, and for providing ample support. CALGARY PRIDE PARADE

Calgary Pride is a safe haven for the 2SLGBTQ+ community where we amplify and elevate voices to advocate for positive change, celebrate our authentic selves, and educate for passionate allyship. Central to this initiative is a commitment to creating inclusive events, like the Calgary Pride Parade & Festival, which is one of the the largest free events in Alberta that celebrates the 2SLGBTQ+ community. Every year attendance to Calgary Pride's Parade and Festival has grown.

The annual Pride Parade and Festival is the pinnacle week dedicated to acknowledging historical and current-day contributions and challenges of the 2SLGBTQ+community and their allies. It is a tangible experience that visibly acknowledges our community.

Pride began as a protest, and attendees at first wore masks and other disguises to hide their identities in fear of retaliation. Today, Pride offers visibility to the 2SLGBTQ+ community, a powerful means through which an individual's identity is not only affirmed, but celebrated. This year, we had 110,000+ attendees, 200+ parade entries, with 76,000+ folks marching in the streets of Calgary in celebration of our communities.






CALGARY PRIDE FESTIVAL

In 2023, Calgary Pride piloted its first two day festival. The two day festival format was chosen to address community needs, creating the opportunity to host 18+ programming on the first day, followed by an all-ages parade and festival the second day. The same year, Calgary Pride hosted its first dedicated sober space called the "Queer Garden'. This new spot was appreciated by attendees, who enjoyed having an alternative space to unwind in addition to our beer gardens. The Calgary Pride Festival is one of the largest free and accessible events in Alberta that celebrates the 2SLGBTQ+ community and this year we welcomed 50,000+ folks at the festival grounds over our two day event!

Calgary Pride was absolutely thrilled to host performers from the National Access Arts Centre, the newly named 1+1 (formerly Indigihauz), Jolene Queen Sloane (the first South Asian Punjabi Drag Queen), Brat Pack!, Rice Queens (of Toronto fame), All That Beth, and Sinzere. Every year, Calgary Pride works to invite a number of talented local and non-local artists to hold performances during the yearly parade and festival who represent the vast intersections of the 2SLGBTQ+ community.



QUEERLY FESTIVE











On December 15th, 2023, the Calgary Central Library came alive with the vibrant spirit of Queerly Festive. This all-ages, free-to-attend holiday soirée, hosted by the charismatic Shane OnYou, offered a magical blend of local entertainment, delicious food, and heartwarming camaraderie. Joined by a lineup of talented performers, including Calgary Men's Chorus and Youth Drag Group, Shane guided attendees through a program that showcased both established voices and incredible emerging talent from Calgary's queer community.

With ASL interpreters and a commitment to sobriety, the event welcomed everyone to share in the festive cheer. A public live stream option ensured that no one missed out on the celebration.

Big thanks to all the amazing volunteers who played a crucial role in making this event a success. We couldn't do it without the support of our community. Shoutout to The Palomino and the Hyatt Regency hotel for generously providing us with an incredible dinner and desserts! Further thanks is offered to the many community partners who reached out to provide us with an array of holiday giveaway prizes.


READING WITH ROYALTY



Reading with Royalty is a beloved initiative, where local drag performers enchant children and families with glamorous, age-appropriate storytime sessions. Calgary Pride has successfully implemented our Reading with Royalty program in various community settings, responding to specific requests and aiming to raise awareness. Our program has been delivered in diverse locations such as East Village, Airdrie Public Library, Okotoks Library, Calgary Zoo, and outdoor reading sessions at Central Memorial Park and St. Patrick's Island. Additionally, we've extended our reach to venues like Esker Foundation, Central Library, and participated in events like Beakerhead.

In recognition of our commitment to inclusivity and safety, Calgary Pride organized a comprehensive training session in 2023. This training was attended by all our readers, staff, and library personnel, providing essential knowledge on Drag 101, Storytime–101, and ensuring familiarity with critical safety protocols to handle disruptions effectively during our events.

In 2021, our program made a significant impact, reaching 1070 individuals through 36 virtual and in-person programs. The following year, in 2022, our reach expanded further with 1257 individuals benefiting from 34 in-person programs. Despite challenges faced in 2023, our impact remained substantial, as we reached 908 individuals through 26 in-person programs. Calgary Pride currently has eight dedicated readers, including one youth participant. These numbers highlight the consistent growth and effectiveness of our initiatives, emphasizing the importance of continued funding to sustain and expand our reach within the community.








With the hard work of the staff, generosity of our sponsors, and dedication of our volunteers 2023 was a successful year financially for Calgary Pride. Last year we exceeded our expectations for donations, grants, and applicant/vendor fees which helped us end the year with positive income despite increased costs.

In 2023 we projected a total income of \$745,950. However, our total income for the year was \$947,922 which was almost \$200,000 more than 2022. Like all Canadian households and businesses we were challenged with increased costs in 2023. Our total expenses in 2023 was \$933,218 with the biggest pieces being staffing and the costs of running the parade/festival. Additionally, security/policing costs were substantially higher due to a challenging environment we're all too aware of: the cost of security and police/municipal services were over \$125,000 for the parade/festival this year which was almost 200% the cost of 2022.

Despite our increased costs we ended the year with net income of \$14,000. In a challenging environment for non-profit organizations this is a big accomplishment and one our organization is very proud of. Thank you very much to all of our sponsors and supporters and we look forward to seeing you at Pride 2024!


